**15<sup>TH</sup> – 18<sup>TH</sup> JUNE 2023**

#### THURSDAY 15<sup>TH</sup> JUNE – *Hot and sunny in light winds, 26C*

We met up in a baking hot Brockenhurst and made the short transfer to our hotel in Lyndhurst, where a welcome cup of tea awaited while the last of the rooms were readied for us. After a swift check-in, we headed out again just after 2pm for Acres Down, where we planned to spend a couple of hours birding the woodland fringe and scanning for raptors. The shady birch woodland on the walk to the raptor viewpoint proved productive, and we walked straight onto a dazzling male **Redstart** and a small mixed flock which contained a smart **Marsh Tit**. Further along, where more Holly and Yew were admixed, we found a pair of **Firecrests** foraging in a low tree by the track. It was a very open Holly which we could stand under and watch the birds flitting at times only a few feet in front of us – superb views! Reaching the open heath, a male **Stonechat** perched up and we saw our first dragonflies – **Emperor**, **Golden-ringed Dragonfly** and a settled immature male **Black-tailed Skimmer**. There was a bit of a breeze at the watchpoint, which was very welcome, and we enjoyed a singing **Willow Warbler** perched up and watched a **Sparrowhawk** circle over the trees. A **Woodlark** sang briefly and flashed past, but we weren't able to relocate it. Heading back by the same route, we heard a **Firecrest** singing, and had some more views of the male **Redstart**, to round off a sultry afternoon.

After dinner we took a walk onto the nearby heath to look for **Nightjars**. Unfortunately some extremely loud music was belting out of a venue in the woods to the south and it made it difficult to hear much, but we eventually heard some churring! When we had pretty much given up and were heading back, a **Nightjar** churred much closer to us, then took flight and bounced right past us silhouetted against the evening sky – brilliant!

#### FRIDAY 16<sup>TH</sup> JUNE – *Hot and sunny in light winds, 26C*

A superb day in the field today started out around Pig Bush near Beaulieu where we headed straight into the shade of the oak woodland and birded along the fringe where it bordered the open heath. Bird activity was high and we soon started to see **Redstarts**, with a speckled juvenile which kept popping up close to us. Two pairs of **Spotted Flycatchers** were sallying around calling above us and a superb **Cuckoo** flew by calling at close quarters. We kept one eye over the distant woodland too and this paid off as a male **Goshawk** soared up distantly and began circling. It was then joined by a much larger female and the two were briefly together before drifting away. Continuing our walk across open heath to another woodland area, we picked up a cracking male **Redstart** which was flitting on and off the track gathering food. More bizarrely though a **Nightjar** then began churring! They do churr in the day sometimes, and it was quite distant, but as we continued on it churred again and we even heard a 'coo-ick' flight call. This really did seem crazy but at least now we had a rough idea where the sound was coming from. Narrowing it down to potentially two large oak trees, we set about scanning all the horizontal branches high up that were in shade, feeling that was most likely. An absolutely brilliant spot then by Toni, as she calmly announced that she thought she'd found it – there was a male **Nightjar** sleeping on a broken branch right in the open! We scoped the bird as it dozed on its lofty perch – a really special treat and quite an exciting moment for the whole group! Leaving it be we retraced our route, getting more superb views of a **Cuckoo** dropping down onto the ground to feed and a brief **Hawfinch** which flashed over.

Next up was a change of scenery as we headed across to Ringwood and visited Blashford Lakes. The tern hide overlooking Ibsley Water added a fair selection of waterbirds for us with the likes of Tufted Duck, Great Crested Grebe, Lapwing and several **Little-ringed Plovers**. **Common Terns** were right outside the hide and we saw a few **Sand Martins** buzzing about too. A very distant **Hobby** was unfortunately not seen by all. Fordingbridge then for an excellent café lunch and break from the oppressive heat, before we headed on to Martin Down.

Balanced on the county border between Hampshire and Wiltshire, this superb NNR boasts a wealth of chalk grassland plantlife and insects. Our amble produced many **Spotted Orchids**, **Fragrant Orchids** and **Pyramidal Orchids**, jangling **Corn Buntings**, great views of singing Skylarks and **Yellowhammers** and a variety of other wildlife. The highlight though was the box fresh male **Adonis Blue** which we were able to watch nectaring on thyme at close range for just a few gorgeous moments before it flitted off on the breeze. Such a great place to amble around and round off a superb day!

**SATURDAY 17<sup>TH</sup> JUNE** – *Hot day after a cooler and overcast start, 24C*

It was tough going at times today with the heat seemingly getting to both us and the birds! We started with a woodland walk from Acres Down car park, to see if we could pick up any additional species. We heard plenty of birds but saw relatively few – **Marsh Tit**, **Firecrest**, **Bullfinch** and **Nuthatch** being examples. At a large clearing, we could hear the begging calls of young **Tree Pipits** secreted among the bracken but didn't see them – though we did pick up some very distant **Crossbills** which settled in the top of a spruce and were visible through the scope. Deciding to switch our venue and try another raptor watch with Honey Buzzard in mind, we headed to another spot in the forest. Here we had more luck with a **Dartford Warbler** singing close to the path as we wandered out across the heath. The bird popped up quite close and sang again and then a second bird started singing behind us. A territorial dispute was in progress with both birds moving towards each other so at one point they were both close to either side of the track which presumably represented the boundary. The second male **Dartford Warbler** perched up brilliantly on a lone gorse bush and sat in the open singing for a full five minutes, allowing everyone to see it brilliantly through the scope. From an area of high ground, we scanned the forest. It was hot, hazy and the light wasn't great, and our 90 minute vigil did not produce any Honey Buzzards. We did see **Goshawk** again



though, with a big female soaring up high over the woods. A **Raven** was also seen well, so we had something to show for our efforts.

Lunch was taken at Beaulieu and then we headed back to the heaths to try for another target bird, the **Woodlark**. Wandering down to an area of open ground covered with bracken and interspersed with a few isolated hawthorns, we picked up a couple of speckly young **Redstarts** feeding and watched them for some while through the scope. Then a party of five **Woodlark** leapt up from the pathside and settled briefly in some bushes before dropping down out of sight. We had seen them, but wanted to hang around for better views so we moved around the far side of the bushes with the light behind us and waited. Eventually an adult **Woodlark** came in and perched with a beak full of food, then dropped into the bracken. Nothing more until eventually eight birds flew up and landed in some silver birch trees – seemingly all spotty juveniles. One perched in a window where we could get a scope on it and we watched it preening there for several minutes. Such a beautiful bird! IN typical **Woodlark** fashion they all melted away back into the bracken again and we left them to it, opting for a cold shower and early finish back at the hotel ourselves!

**SUNDAY 18<sup>TH</sup> JUNE** – *Sunny spells and dry, 20C*

A change of scenery for our final morning as we headed around to the other side of Southampton Water to visit Titchfield Haven NR. A short check along the canal path further north up the valley first yielded a few bits we had not previously had on the trip, such as **Cetti's Warbler**, **Shelduck**, **Reed Bunting**, **Green Woodpecker** and **Sedge Warbler**. Parking on the coast overlooking the Isle of Wight, we saw our first **Common Terns** before heading down to the Meon Shore Hide. Here there was plenty of activity – the reduction in Black-headed Gull numbers due to HPAI has evidently aided the **Avocets** with higher than normal productivity on the site this year, and lots of chicks were seen. Several drake **Teal** already in their summer moult, a couple of **Gadwall** families and **Reed Warbler**

were also noted here. Only one **Mediterranean Gull** was noted – a second-summer bird which flew towards the hide. Walking on round to the further hide, we stopped to watch a **Four-spotted Chaser** defending it's perch over a small channel where lots of **Azure Damselfly** were also flying and a shoal of Roach were loafing just below the surface. The further hide gave us superb views of a female **Marsh Harrier**, **Little Grebe**, brief **Cuckoo** and a big flock of **Black-tailed Godwits** which came up and wheeled around when flushed by the **Marsh Harrier**. A pleasant couple of hours to round off the tour, but now it was time to head back to Lyndhurst for drop-offs and the journey back to London & Norfolk.
